# **Beley Lecture**

Marc Beaudoin, AIH

Marc Beaudoin is an historian and heraldist. He is associate member of the International Academy of Heraldry (AIH) and member of the Laurentian Branch of the Royal Heraldic Society of Canada. Since his retirement from the Quebec public service in 2010, he has been active in researching coats of arms of historic figures and heraldic art. He was also one of the founding members of the heraldry committee of the Société de généalogie de Québec, President of the Société historique de Québec, the Association des archivistes du Québec and the Fédération History Quebec. In addition to training and conferences, he is the author of some sixty articles on historical coats of arms in L'Héraldique au Canada, as well as in L'Ancêtre de la Société de généalogie de Québec and Mémoires de la Société généalogique canadienne-française and other historical publications.

Mr. Robert Boily will be the principal speaker at our Saturday banquet at the Officers Mess of the The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment). Mr. Robert Boily is an internationally recognized scientist. He specializes in physics, electro-optics and education which earned him a Ph.D. He held positions with Eastman Kodak, the Centre de recherche Industrielle du Québec and founded the scientific and technological research firm Inforex. He currently sits on the Royal Society of Canada selection committee, conducts peer reviews for the *Journal of Medical Imaging and Radiation Sciences* and serves as a director of Sigma Xi Scientific Society (USA). Among his other appointments, he is member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science nominations committee and serves as the Organisation International de la Francophonie science expert. He is also Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada as well as of the American Society of Physics, of the Physics Institute, Institution of Engineering and Technology, World Academy of Arts and Science and the American Association for the Advancement of Science. He is also currently Vice-Chancellor of the Sovereign Order of Malta Canadian

Association and a Knight of St. John as well as of the Ordre du Québec, of France's Ordre des Palmes académiques and of the Ordre de la Pléiade.

Mr. Christian Samoisette is Montreal and Quebec City region Vice-President of the Sovereign Order of Malta Canadian Association. He earned a master's degree in management and organizational development, as well as a bachelor's degree in Nursing Sciences. After 16 years of service in the Canadian Armed Forces, he joined the Quebec Health Network where from 2008-2014 he served as Emergency Measures and Civil Protection Coordinator. Mr. Samoisette is currently employed as an Emergency Measures and Civil Protection Advisor for the West-Central for the University of Montreal Health Center. A keen history buff, he has been involved in the Order of Malta since 2004. He was invested as a Knight of Magistral Grace in 2008, in the Canadian Association. In 2013, he established a Training Program for the postulants, as well as for the volunteers of the Order of Malta, which earned him internationally accolades from that organization. Since then, he has undertaken responsibility for training for both the Montreal and Quebec City regions for the Order of Malta.

### **Forget House**

1195 Sherbrooke West

The Laurentian Branch will hold all AGM meetings at its Head Office located at the historic Louis-Joseph Forget House, depicted pictured on the front page. The building is located on the last surviving block from the legendary era when Montreal's Golden Square Mile was the epitome of luxury and wealth. It was originally the home of 19<sup>th</sup>-century business magnate Senator Louis-Joseph Forget. After World War I, it became the United Services Club, serving thousands of returning Canadian veterans who needed a place to socialize with their peers. In the 1990s, the MacDonald Stewart Foundation bought and then restored the building to its pristine mid-19<sup>th</sup>-century condition. Our activities will take place in the various ground floor reception rooms. Please note that Forget House has capacity constraints and should attendees be more numerous than expected, some activities may be moved to the next door Le Cantlie Suites hotel. You will be advised accordingly.

# **Black Watch Armory**

The closing banquet on Saturday night will be held in the Officers' Mess at the impressive Black Watch Armory. The Black Watch Armoury is a Scottish baronial-style building in Montreal, completed in 1906 to house the 5th Regiment of the Royal Highlanders of Canada, now known as The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada. The premises were declared a National Historic Site in 2008. The armory is located diagonally opposite the Place des Arts Metro station and street parking is available in the vicinity.
